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## Anti bullying week

Anti-Bullying week will take place from the 14th to 18th November 2022 and has the theme Reach Out. The week will kick off with Odd Socks Day on Monday 14th November, where adults and children wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. We would like to invite all children to wear odd socks on Monday to start our conversations about bullying and raise awareness.

Unfortunately, Bullying does happen and whilst we would love to say that it doesn't exist at Brook, we know that it does, but we really want to do all that we can to stop it.

Bullying is a deliberate act which happens <u>repeatedly over time</u> to cause distress solely in order to give a feeling of power, status or other gratification to the bully. It can range from ostracising, name-calling, teasing, threats and extortion, through to physical assault on persons and/or their property. It is not a standalone incident, which can be dealt with swiftly.

#### **Actions**

We believe that bullies are not bad, but the behaviour they exhibit is not acceptable and we often have to put support in place to help the bully understand this. Bullying, either physical, verbal or cyber (mobile phones/social network websites), in or outside of the school grounds, will not be tolerated. It is everyone's responsibility to aim to prevent occurrences of bullying and to deal with any incidents quickly and effectively. It is also important that parents and children understand exactly what bullying is, to ensure when real incidents are reported, they can be dealt with effectively. It is vitally important that teachers listen to and act upon information given by children and/or parents.

## If you believe that your child is being bullied...

Please reach out! We are here to help!

In the first instance, please raise your concerns with the class teacher so that they can put actions in place. If the problem persists, in line with our complaints policy you will be directed to the phase leader and then to a member of the Senior Leadership team so that a plan can be put in place.



Next week, we will be talking to the children about bullying and what they should do if they feel they are being bullied.
