What a fantastic couple of weeks we've had!




World Book Day

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Everyone's talking about AI, and with many children and young people hearing about and using AI online, it's important they have the skills and confidence to make safe choices when they are using smart technology.

We are exploring the impact of AI on all of our lives, looking at how AI can be used for good, and giving advice and guidance that empowers people to use AI safely and responsibly.


Below are some links that parents and carers may wish to access to help them understand the use of AI and how to keep their children safe online.

Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online. What games do you and your friends like to play online? Can you show me the websites you visit the most? Shall we play your favourite game online together?	Ask them about how they stay safe online. Where can they go to find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block on the services they use?	Think about how you each use the internet. The British Science Week 2026 poster competition is open now!

The theme pupils will be exploring during British Science Week is 'Curiosity: What's your question?' This year, the poster competition is taking curiosity to the next level! The Government Office for Science are curious about what children think will make a 'good'/'positive' childhood in the future.

Children in early years (aged 3-5) will think about the question '**What makes children's lives good?**'

Primary aged children (aged 5-11) should consider the questions, '**What makes children's lives positive? What will a positive childhood look like in the future for children your age?**'

Judges will be looking for a **creative approach**, **clear content** (thoughtful response to the research question) and a poster that effectively **communicates** ideas in an **engaging** way. Entries must be one page of A4 or A3 paper and have the entrant's first name, age and class written on the back. Brook Primary can only select a maximum of five entries to be sent off. (Please note if you do not wish for pupil's name and age to be submitted to the competition then please make this clear on the entry and only the school's name will be shared.) 


