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Starting secondary school in September 2023?

If your child is due to start secondary school in 2023 then you will have to apply for a secondary school place before 5pm on 31st October 2022.

You must complete an application form either online at www.dudley.gov.uk/admissions

or by completing the application form provided by your home local authority. You can include 6 school preferences on the application form.

You should not assume that your child will get a place at a secondary school without you having to apply, even if you have an older child already attending the same school. This is a common misconception and often the biggest cause of disappointment for parents who believe otherwise.
