Appointments are for 5-minute slots, books will not be shared at this appointment as the children have only just started and it is more a conversation about how they have settled and a chance for you to ask any questions or raise concerns.



October is International Walk to School Month and the autumn WOW Walk of Fame Challenge!

Thousands of pupils will be making an extra effort to walk/wheel to school (cycle, scoot or use park and stride) to try and top their local and national leaderboard, and we hope our school will join us.



You don't need to do anything extra to take part; just keep travelling to school actively and log your journeys on the WOW Travel Tracker in class each day.

The benefits of walking to school:

- Children feel happier and healthier
- They arrive to school refreshed, healthy, and ready to learn
- A reduction in congestion and pollution at the school gates



If you can't walk to school...

Park and Stride to help your child earn their WOW badge. You can park or hop off public transport at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the remaining journey.

Badges:

There are 11 badges to be earned from September 2022 - July 2023. Each badge has been designed by a pupil from across the UK as part of our annual WOW Badge Design Competition. A new badge can be earned every month if you walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride at least once a week.

Please support us on Census day (Thursday 6th October) by booking a school meal via ParentPay. Please see the menu on the poster below. Funding is awarded based on school meals taken on Census day, which benefits all of our children.



Drinks in school
