Significantly struggling to afford food, pay bills and buy essentials?

We understand that times are tough because of the ongoing cost of living crisis, and we're able to provide help at our Cost of Living Support Hubs

Our funding allows households to attend the hubs a maximum of 3 times since they opened on 30th January 2023. This is for any of our hubs (i.e. 3 times across any hub and not per hub). Also, there needs to be a minimum of 12 days between each appointment. Please make sure you read ALL information on our Eventbrite page when you book.

If you book an appointment and don't meet the criteria to be able to attend, we will either cancel your appointment before the day or decline entry on the day. So to limit disappointment, we kindly ask you to adhere to this request. If you can't book an appointment and need help due to the cost of living crisis, please go to Dudley Council's website for additional help:https://www.dudley.gov.uk/costofliving

What happens in the Hubs..

When you arrive in our Hub, one of our friendly Hub staff will greet you and complete an assessment to establish your eligibility for support

Poverty relieving practical assistance will then be provided based on your assessment

For example:

✓ Giving information on how to save money and make money stretch further

✓ Offering practical help relating to access to food, fuel, energy, period products, available benefits, grants and funds based on qualifying criteria

✓ Showing how energy usage can be reduced and ways to save money on utilities

✓ Issuing a voucher per household to purchase essentials (NB: these vouchers can only be issued in a crisis, and are subject to availability)

> Issuing a fuel bank voucher (NB: subject to eligibility)

✓ Identifying other organisations that can help with the struggles being experienced

Access to all of our Hubs is by pre booked appointment only, and appointments can only be booked via our Eventbrite page:

Due to the demand for our Hubs, the appointments usually fill up quickly. However, people can follow our Eventbrite page and this will notify them of when new appointments have been released.

In the Hubs, our friendly Hub Staff will be able to provide:

- Information on how to save money
- Practical help relating to access to food, fuel, energy, benefits and grants
 - Ways to reduce energy usage
- Issuing a voucher per household to purchase essentials
 - Issuing a fuel voucher



The 4th Cost of Living Support Hub, opened at Christ Church in Lye on the 28th September.

The hubs are funded by DMBC and the ICB, to respond to the difficulties many people continue to face because of the financial increases we are seeing in so many areas (termed cost of living crisis).

Since the 30th January 2023 we have been helping the community through our existing Hubs in Dudley, Halesowen and Brierley Hill and we have now expanded our service to Lye.









The week beginning the <u>16th October</u> is our harvest week, a time when we support our local food bank to help those less fortunate than ourselves.

Our Year 2 and Year 5 children have been preparing a harvest assembly and Year 2 parents will be invited to join us on Tuesday 17th October at 2.45pm and Year 5 parents are invited on Thursday 19th October at 2.45pm.

During the week we will be asking for donations, which we will be taking to the food bank. Donations can be made any day from the 16th-20th October. Please see the attached poster which explains which items are in demand this year.

- ★ Listen to each child read at least once a week
- Teach explicit reading skills for at least 30
 minutes each day
- Provide our children with engaging reading material (This year we have invested over £3000 in new books!)
- Provide access to an extensive school library
- Provide comfortable and inviting reading areas
 for children

Parents/carers, reading to your child at home is just as important! There can be few things as powerful as regularly reading to a child. It has astonishing benefits for children: comfort and reassurance, confidence and security, relaxation, happiness and fun. Giving a child time and full attention when reading them a story, or them reading you a story, tells them they matter. It builds self-esteem, vocabulary, feeds imagination and even improves their sleeping patterns.

At Brook this year, we want to celebrate reading regularly so we are introducing 'Reader of the Week' for each class. The children will achieve a certificate from their class teacher and will be celebrated in class. To achieve reader of the week children will:

- Read regularly at home.
- 🛧 🔹 Share books with other people.
- 🔆 🔹 Make book recommendations.
- Have evidence of regular comments in reading records from parents or themselves.
- ★ Use the school library regularly.
- ☆ Visit libraries in the local area.
- ☆ Engage in discussions during 'Book Talk'.
- Examples of great reading skills in lessons.
- Read a range of types/genres/authors of books.
 - Make progress with their reading.

Additionally, we always enjoy hearing about how children are engaging in reading activities outside of school so please continue to share these with us to support our children with their reading journeys.

We ask that you please write regularly in your child's reading record when read with them at home.
