- All the donations of food and toiletries come from local churches, schools, individuals and local shops.
- The Black Country Foodbank began from a dining room table!
- The food parcels contain a variety of tinned and packaged food.
- Toiletries and household items such as toilet roll and cleaning products can be asked for.

Although everyone's donations help people out, the Black Country Foodbank have seen a huge increase in families needing to use the service. Over the last few years, the numbers have increased from around 500 families using the service, to a staggering half a million families over the whole of the Black Country. With this in mind, we would encourage you to continue donating as much as you can to this amazing charity. Donations can be made directly to the Foodbank in Brierley Hill, or placed in the donation boxes/ trolleys in supermarkets.

Wellbeing Corner

What causes anxiety?

"Anxiety evolved to protect us. It's generated by our primal brain, which has the job of keeping us safe and out of danger. Our primal brain constantly scans for danger and as soon as it detects a threat, it floods us with adrenaline, creating physical symptoms such as dizziness, sweating, trembling, nausea and more. This causes the fight/flight/freeze response that people experience when suffering from acute anxiety.

"If we're in life-threatening danger we need these automatic reactions. Thankfully most of the time we don't need them, but they can easily kick in - causing anxiety, distress and negatively impacting our life."
