WATER

The start of the academic year is always a proud moment for me as I welcome 400 children back to school looking smart in their uniforms and with huge smiles on their faces, as they are enthusiastic to start their new school year.

There are some children who find starting back at school more difficult, but I'm sure that they'll be skipping in soon. Please remember that I'm always around so please just ask if you need any help or support as we will be there for you, if we can.

<u>Water Bottles</u> - We encourage our children to bring water bottles into school. Drinking plenty of water keeps the body hydrated, which equals happy and bright children! Not only does it boost mental and physical performance, but water is vital to a child's development and general well-being, for a variety of reasons.

We have noticed a lot of children coming to school with highly-concentrated squash and juice. Consuming too many sugary drinks and fruit juices can lead to dental problems. Water is kind to little teeth, and helps keep them healthy and strong.

Please encourage your children to bring water to school and NOT squash. Water helps the brain to function, keeps children energised, and boosts concentration, which can all help our clever children excel in the classroom.

Reading allows us to be transported from our own world to another. Between the pages of a book, we can become immersed in the lives of fictional characters and learn about a culture entirely different from our own


We can also learn new words and phrases, experience a range of emotions, and acquire skills and knowledge.

You may have noticed a few new faces around school—please say hello and give them a big Brook welcome!




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Mrs Bishop has joined us as our new Reception teacher!







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
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Mrs Fakira has joined us to work in the Key stage 2 Hub!












Miss Page has joined us as the new Year 5 class teacher.

Children are encouraged to wear:

- · Grey trousers (long or short) or a grey pinafore/skirt
- Blue check/gingham dress summer only, optional
- Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan/fleece
- Light blue shirt/blouse, long or short sleeved.
- A royal blue school tie with silver stripe
- Sensible shoes (no trainers or high heels)
- A small bag and satchel for books and personal effects

PE Kit:

Pumps. Slip-on pumps are preferred for Reception children.

Black or navy shorts

White T-shirt

Children need a suitable string bag to keep P.E. kit in with name or initials on for identification purposes.

Children may wear a plain blue/black tracksuit for outdoor games in the winter months.

Children in Years **3 and 4** need a swimming costume, towel and swimming hat.

We have high expectations of pupils' appearance.

Also it is so important that you label your children's clothes. Last year we had bags and bags of lost property with no names on!

We often have irate parents who are understandably upset when clothing is lost but often it is not labelled and this makes finding it very difficult.











<u>School Dinners</u> - Unfortunately, we have noticed a huge increase in food costs and when completing our end of year finances, we have had to review some of our charges.

Unfortunately, this does mean that from 1^{st} October, the price of a

school meal will increase from £2.40 to £2.50 per meal. Also please remember that you must order them on time every day. When a dinner isn't ordered, your child will be offered a sandwich, which is a huge shame as we prefer our pupils to have a healthy hot meal.
