**Happy New Year to all our children and parents - we hope you all had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year!**



#### **PE Days**

#### **Spring Term Curriculum:**

- **English** – Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, a range of text types about the story.
- **Maths** – multiplication and division, length and perimeter, fractions and mass and capacity.
- **Science** – rocks, forces and magnets.
- **History** – Ancient Greeks and their city states Athen and Sparta.
- **Geography** – Why is Greece such a popular holiday destination?
- **Design Technology** – seasonal and nutritional eating.
- **Art** – sketching and creating Greek pottery.
- **Spanish** – numbers, days of the week, months of the year and how to write and say the date.
- **Music** – violins with Mrs Pennycook
- **Computing** – use Purple Mash to create and understand computer codes.
- **RE** – significance of God, Muhammad and the Prophets within Islam
- **PSHE** – how to lead a successful life in the wider world e.g. understanding how the internet is used safely, values, laws and rights and how different jobs need different skills.
- **PE** – gymnastics and basketball, quidditch and boccia.



#### **Reading at home**

#### **Multiplication Table Practice**

In the back of your child's planner there is a log in to TTRS. Over the next few months, we will be focusing more on our times tables in preparation for Year 4. Please practice as often as you can to help the children improve their quick recall of the multiplication facts.

They will also be taking home times table flash cards, currently just the 2s however we will be focusing on more as the weeks go on. Please practise these in short, sharp burst. The end goal is to have your child recalling the fact in less than 5 seconds.

#### **Spelling**

We practise our spellings for 15 minutes each morning. Most children will have the spellings listed below, however some children may need different spellings. For these children, they will be allowed to take their spelling book home which will have their target spellings printed in the book for additional practise at home.
