KEY FACTS

There is always an upside-down question mark at the beginning of a question: ¿Cómo te llamas? There is always an upside-down exclamation mark at the beginning of an exclamation: ¡Hola! Il is pronounced as y as in yellow. y is pronounced as e as in eat. \tilde{n} - the mark above an n is called a tilde and adds a /y/ sound.

Accents above letters (á,é,í,ó,ú) show which letter in a word to emphasise. Days of the week and months do not have capital letters in Spanish.
