KEY FACTS

There is always an upside-down question mark at the beginning of a question: ¿Cómo te llamas? There is always an upside-down exclamation mark at the beginning of an exclamation: ¡Hola! Il is pronounced as y as in yellow.

y is pronounced as e as in eat.

 \tilde{n} - the mark above an n is called a tilde and adds a /y/ sound. Accents above letters $(\acute{a},\acute{e},\acute{i},\acute{o},\acute{u})$ show which letter in a word to emphasise.
