This half term we are learning all about living and growing. The children will be exploring the world around them including mini beasts, plants and how to look after our planet.

We will be exploring life cycles and classifying living things. The children will create observational drawings of plants and mini beasts. They will be looking at the different life cycles and how things change over time. The children will also be exploring what can be recycled and how it can help our planet.

Questions to Ask



Where can we find mini beasts? Why do you think we find mini-beasts there? How do they change as they grow? What is the same? What is different?

What do plants need to grow? Can you name the parts of a plant? Why do plants need sunlight?

Why do we need to recycle? What materials can be recycled? How do we recycle?
