Breaktimes

Here at Brook, we value our breaktimes for both staff and children and recognise the importance of being able to get some fresh air, take a break from learning and to socialise with friends. However, there are occasions when we keep children in for breaktime, up to a maximum of five minutes. For example, this may be to practise lining up, expectations for assembly, opportunities for restorative work or to complete missed work due to behaviour choices. We recognise the importance of playtime and fresh air which is why we do not take whole play/breaktimes from children generally. The five minutes rule ensures that the children then have ample time to still have a break outside and eat their lunch/snack.

Unfortunately, we do have to deal with some severe behaviours/bullying. Thankfully these are infrequent but, on these occasions, we may need to take a child's breaktime in full, but this is always communicated with the parent and an alternative time to have a run around/access to fresh air will be organised, because we understand its importance.

Whilst keeping children in at break is not our preferred consequence, there are times when it is necessary. Thank you for your continued support.

Online Safety

With the half term break and summer holidays fast approaching children and young people will have more free time to spend with friends, family and online.

For some, this will be spent using the internet to keep in touch with friends, catch up with the latest apps and online terns, and playing their favourite games. Unfortunately, whilst the internet has many benefits there are also many dangers, particularly for children. It is essential that children are supervised when using the internet and that you regularly talk to them and check their online use, in order to keep them safe. Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing from 19th August 2024

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices issued by DfE, the following changes will come into force for School Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Please note: The DfE does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Per Parent*, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent*, for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

*Parent

Section 576 of the Education Act 1996 defines "parent" as:

- All natural (biological) parents, whether they are married or not.
- Any person who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility for a child or young person.
- Any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or young person.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case could be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in Criminal records and fines of up to £2,500

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court may show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
