We are very excited to announce that we will soon be having a new sensory room installed in school.

What is a sensory room?

A <u>sensory room</u> is a specially designed room which combines a range of stimuli to help individuals develop and engage their <u>senses</u>. These can include lights, colours, sounds, sensory <u>soft</u> <u>play</u> resources and <u>aromas</u>, all used within a safe environment that allows the person using it to explore and interact without risk.

There are many benefits of a sensory room for those who have learning difficulties, developmental disabilities or sensory processing impairments, helping them learn to interact with the world around them in a safe environment that builds up their confidence and their ability.

Our new sensory room will be installed on Wednesday 1st February and to get everyone involved we are asking for your help... can you think of a name for the new room? If you have any ideas or suggestions, please hand them into Mrs Fellows and she will be choosing a winner, whose name will be selected and made into a plague for the door.

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
