E Safety - We are programmers -to develop safe search habits, what information they can share online, obtaining parental permission, We are bug fixers - acceptable behaviour online. We are presenters – Permission and strict policies over filming. We are network engineers - implications for privacy, We are communicators - safe use of email. We are opinion Pollsters - appropriate info to give in an online survey

RE - What rules should we live by?, Pupils begin to show an awareness of similarities and differences in religions. Pupils ask, and respond sensitively to, questions about their own and others' experiences and feelings and begin to give reasons for their thoughts. In matters of right and wrong, they recognise their own values and those of others.
