# SAFEGUARDING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM

Safeguarding is the highest priority within Brook Primary School. The school recognises that are pupils can be vulnerable.

Therefore, in addition to ensuring our safeguarding procedures and training needing to be of the highest standard and ensuring staff remain vigilant we also recognise the need to safeguard our pupils through education.

## The legal context for safeguarding education

These duties are set out in the **2002 Education Act** (the 2**010 Academies Act** also refers to the broad and balanced curriculum). Schools also have statutory responsibilities in relation to promoting pupil wellbeing and pupil safeguarding (**Children Act 2004**) and community cohesion (**Education Act 2006**). The Equality Act 2010 also places duties on schools to help to reduce prejudice-based bullying and in doing so to keep protected characteristic groups safe. PSHE education plays an important part in fulfilling all of the responsibilities.

### PSHE education in the national curriculum

While PSHE education is a non-statutory subject, section 2.5 of the National Curriculum framework document states that:

*All schools should make provision for PSHE, drawing on good practice.'* Along with the National Curriculum framework, the DFE also published guidance on PSHE education, which states that the subject is 'an *important and necessary part of all pupils' education*' and that:

'Schools should seek to use PSHE education to build, where appropriate, on the statutory content already outlined in the national curriculum, the basic school curriculum and in statutory guidance on: drug education, financial education, sex and relationship education (SRE) and the importance of physical activity and diet for a healthy lifestyle.'

### **Religious Education**
